



Doug Adkins – Artist Bio

Montana born and raised, Doug Adkins writes country songs about Dirt Roads and Fence Lines — about the kind of life that doesn't make the headlines, but makes the person who they've become. Drawing on a Midwestern upbringing where farm kids were allowed to stay home from school during harvest season, his songs carry the rhythm of real work, real life, and real people.

Imagine watching the Northern Lights after a perfect day doing Montana things — going to the county fair, a little fishing, small-town football and homecoming night, or dropping a couple of free throws to take your team to the state basketball tournament. It all sounds like a slice of small-town heaven most people can only imagine, but it happened there in Northeastern Montana, and those moments still find their way into the songs that Doug Adkins writes.

Don't Question Love is Doug's twelfth album — twelve new songs written and recorded with the same honesty that has carried him through more than three decades on the road. Track eight, "Free," stands as a tribute to the 250th anniversary of the United States and to the freedom that shaped both his life and his music. Doug Adkins remains what he's always been — a Montana singer-songwriter sharing the stories and the life experiences that have shaped the artist he is today.
